Somerset Historic Building Awards

... for excellence in design and conservation

The Somerset Historic Building Awards are given every two years to recognise the very best in design and conservation of:

- Mew buildings, whether one or several houses (but not a large estate) in a historic setting;
- ▼ The repair, alteration or extension of an existing building;
- ▼ The conversion of old buildings to beneficial uses.

The project should preferably relate to a historic building or site within a conservation area and must have been completed within the last two years.

Applications for an award can be submitted by:

- ▼ The owner of the building(s);
- ▼ The architect/designer;
- ▼ The contractor.

These prestigious awards are organised by the **Somerset Building Preservation Trust** and highlight the positive contribution that well-designed and conserved buildings make to their surroundings and to the character of local communities in Somerset.

The Trust was founded in 1988 to help preserve the architectural heritage of the county and inform the public about the importance of preserving and enhancing the man-made environment. Over the years the Trust has restored a number of the county's historic buildings and brought them back into use and is actively working to save other buildings at risk.
